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Preface

It was a year full of projects and help to many children. But it was also a year where the coordinator Michael let the foundation to find a better life in America. It came as a shock because we were not prepared for that. But thankfull we are for our other two team members in Cameroon who took their responsibility to make the foundation not feel the lost. They took Michaels assignments as if they never did anything else. We thank them so much for their reliable position. Beside this we welcomed a new Needs For Children baby. Our secretary Marie put to birth a beautiful baby girl. She was absence for some time in the office, but she always kept the contact with the team in the Netherlands. So we are grateful for her commitment. Who also showed her love for the foundation is our community worker: Clara. Despite of how everything went this year, she was always there to make sure things were going smoothly. Thanks so much for that.

The foundation is getting really known in Kumba and the direct villages around. More and more people know where to find the office to seek for help. The foundation is still organized in a basically simple way in order to be able to give direct support to the local population in groups as well as individually. We help children at the time and place of direct needs. In this way we can build a relationship with the child and the family. This in order to make sure quality of care and support we offer is optimal. After support has been given we stay in direct contact with the child to ensure that our goals will be accomplished. Also the prison and orphanages projects are direct and personal.

With our team in Cameroon we accomplish a lot of goals and carry out a lot of projects and help. However, it is impossible to fulfill all the projects without the help we get from volunteers and contributors from the Netherlands. Besides of the individuals there have also been companies that put effort in the foundation and can be relied on in the future. Of course this does not happen by itself, the foundation put a lot of effort in finding publicity. We made the newspapers several times and events were organized. The team in the Netherlands, led by Liesbeth van Elderen, managed fundraising by organizing flea markets, fairs, presentations, clothing parties, and so on. Also in Best and the direct villages the foundation is really known. People often come bring clothes and toys for the children in Cameroon. We mostly send it to Cameroon but since it is so much we also sell them in the shop in Best. Everything we earn from that goes directly to the foundation.

Since 2016 the situation in Cameroon is dangerous because of strikes and killing going on. Some areas in the South West of Cameroon is so dangerous that even the foundation can't go there anymore. Because of this reason, the president of the foundation, Kim van Elderen, has not been visiting Cameroon since 2016. The team in Cameroon has been constantly in contact with the president so that she is involved in all the projects going on.

In this annual report we want to give an overview of what the foundation did during this year on the side of projects, fund raising and of course the finances in detail. Apart from that we will take a short preview to 2020. Needs For Children is an open foundation and that is the reason why all finances are explained in detail.



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Needs For Children

The foundation was started on 17 October 2011 in Best. The idea originates from Kim van Elderen. Since 2009 she has been traveling regularly to Cameroon to work on a voluntary basis as a nurse in the Ejed Medical Foundation, Kumba-Cameroon.

Her experiences have shown her that the children in and around Kumba need a lot of help. Before she started her foundation, she provided aid to children with financial help, by donating material to an orphanage and by improving the facilities of the Ejed Medical Foundation. It was not easy to do this all as an individual, so Kim started her foundation to be able to help the children even more and to give them better opportunities in life.

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Collaborating organizations in Cameroon

- 1) Ejed Medical Foundation. The hospital is now led by Medical Officer Nzume Micahel. We have been collaboration with them from the beginning. In the Ejed Medical Foundation we treat our sick children and are our new babies born.
- 2) Kumba District General Hospital. The Government hospital in Kumba. They call when they need help for sick children who were left by their selves. In collaboration with them we look how we can help and also the hospital helps a percentage of 50%.
- 3) Kumba Central Prison. The prison in Kumba works closely together with the Foundation. Together we ensure quality of care in prison for minor prisoners. Where the Government offers no help, we will do so.
- 4) Ministry of Social Affairs. They are our back up. They are kept informed of the projects we do and they see where they can help. And the other way around.
- 5) DGRE. They protect the Foundation where necessary. They also take care that reports about the work of the NGO are written down and send to the Government in Yaoundé. This to make them know about Needs For Children.



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Fundraising

Needs For Children performed within the budget. We had to cancel 3 projects because we did not see the purpose of it this year. And made us to be able to add 3 other purposes. This year no World Aids day but we put Labourday and Partners (end of year feast). This to show the team in Cameroon our respect.



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Projects

Next a short description of the several projects with illustration and costs overview.

1) Orphanages

We always help the orphanages whenever they need help. It can be material of help with their health. This year we went to 4 different orphanages (Frathekk, Azi, Mahdi and Clephic)

in Kumba to give them their own Christmas. We bought a lot of foodstuff and savon.

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2) Medical help to children

The foundation helps children who need medical support or need a medical tool to improve quality of life. Besides of that the foundation has become a place for other organizations to search for help in case they lack the resources for helping a child. We study a child's situation with the whole team to make a support plan. Below the children we offered support with a short description.

Abara Becky

We met Becky, 21 years, on the 2^{nd} of August 2019 at the corridors of the District Hospital when we went to check on another case. She was crying of abdominal pains and needed urgent operation on appendicitis. Becky was operated upon successfully on the 3^{rd} and was discharged on the 8^{th} of August 2019.

Abia Alex

Alex, 8 years, was brought to the office by his mother. He is one of a twin. He had a swollen face and complained of fever. he is Abia Lisette's twin brother. After consulting him in the Ejed Clinic, they discovered that he was sick of Malaria. He was being placed on malaria treatment and ceftriaxone.

Abia Lizette

Lizette, 9 years, the other half of the twin. With her brother Alex they came to the office on the 9th of October 2019 and after consultation and lab tests conducted we discovered that she too was sick of Malaria and has an umbilical hernia. She could not be operated bc of low HB. Drugs was given and she will still have a rendezvous in 2020.

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Akrambong Blessing

A 4 year old girl who has been sick since her mother died 3 months ago. She came into the office with her aunt who pleaded for medical help. The aunt has been helping the child but now the child reached the level of convulsion so that aunt didn't know what to do anymore. The child was send by the foundation to the Ejed Clinic. After consultation the lab results showed that she had malaria and an infection. She was treated for both.

Asani Bronhilda



Bronhilda is 15 years and was brought by Dr. Michael. She had to run from her own village because of the crisis. Her mother is a widow and the only provider. Bronhilda was send to the hospital but had no money. That's how the foundation came in. Bronhilda was suffering of itches at the private part. She was place on injections and antibiotics. She is doing well now after the treatment.

Che Abigail Lum

Since 2013 the foundation helps Abigail. Now she is 10 years and has improved a lot. She can walk, talk clearly, sing, and can easily identify members of the Needs For Children team each time she is visited. The mother even suspect that Abigail sees even a little because each time the team comes she is reacting. The foundation is visiting her every month with foodstuff. This to help the mum who is partly blind herself. Even though the mother too has improved greatly because Abigail is no longer dirty or abandon to herself.

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Destiny Njasotapha

A 4 year old boy who was brought by his mother to the office to plead for medical help. After consultation and lab tests, the child showed he had malaria, typhoid and low hemoglobin. He was placed on drugs which helped him a lot.

Enjema Blessing

The foundation met the 21 years old Enjema in the General Hospital on the 13th of October. Enjema was epileptic, anemic, and pregnant with preeclampsia. She was very swollen when we met her. Needs For Children came in to help her to make sure she could deliver a healthy baby. She was transfused and later induced and finally gave birth to bouncing baby boy. We helped her to pay her medical bills, transfusion and delivery fees. And offcourse we couldn't allow her to go home without a lot of baby needs and clothes. 63 950 cfa = € 97,63



Gabriel Tarbinchinyi

Gabriel is a child we once helped, in April 2018 on Malnutrition. In that time he was admitted at General Hospital. He couldn't sit down or creep because of malnutrition. Because of the help the foundation gave that time, Gabriel is now fine. He came to the office to greet us and off course we can't allow him go home before giving presents.

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Joyce

We know Joyce already for some years when we send her to the deaf school in Kumba. Because of the crisis the school close and Joyce had to go back to Mbalangi. Since the crisis became violent the family had to run into the bush because of fear of gunshots. While in the bush, Joyce felt sick and the mother brought her to the office pleading for medical help. Needs For Children decided to help her again, this time with treatment. She was consulted and treated and went back in good health with the mother. They now live in Mbanga.

Kadji Leonel

A girl who we help in 2015/2016. She is now 12 years. She is an epileptic girl. She often falls and get wounds. This time she came with her sister to the office. Dr. Michael Nzume prescribed her drugs against the eplileptic and the wounds were taken care of. They headed back to the bush in Marumba were they have been living.

Kim-Liesbeth

Kim-Liesbeth was born on the 24th of January 2019. The pregnant girl was brought to Ejed Clinic by her boyfriend Bekumaka. They ran the crisis from Bekora to kumba after their house was burnt down. The girl gave birth to a baby girl in the Ejed Clinic without anything to wear and catered for the child. Needs For Children took care and bought all the maternity needs for the baby and the baby girl delivered was named after the NGO's President and her mum; Kim- Liesbeth. When they were discharged they were escorted home by the Needs For Children team. A matrass was also given.





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Libieh Peculiar

A 9 years old boy who was brought by the mother to the office in June pleading for medical help. Libieh was consulted and diagnosed of Malaria. We bought some drugs for him and they left happily.

Mathias

The coordinator of the foundation travelled 3 hours to Manyemen to visit baby Mathias. The child we help last year. He was one of the twin but his twin sister died. We went just to see how he is doing and luckly we met him in a healthy condition.

Naoussi Rejoice

Rejoice Blessing, 10 months old, was found during a community visit carried out in their area at Mahole. Rejoice is a water head patient and the family pleaded with us to help their child medically. Blessing was delivered in good condition and 3 months after, the parents noticed that the neck was bending one side, the fore head started swollen and she was removing a shimmy liquid (draw spit) through her mouth. Needs For Children decided to take care and send Rejoice Blessing to the hospital in Buea on the 31st of July. On the 20th of November she was operated and it was successful. On arrival for the rendezvous at Solidarity clinic the doctor said she is improving and gave them another rendezvous in January 2020. 841 500 cfa = € 1284,73

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Nformi Stemarest

Bb Stemarest, 5 weeks old, was suffering from fever, loss of appetite, and too much crying. Needs For Children came in to help with lab tests and treatment. It came out that he was anemic. Immediately he was transfused blood and drugs was given. Nformi Stemarest left the hospital much better.

Ngoh Lemuel

Needs For Children was called to the District Hospital in October 2019 because of a premature baby. Baby Lemuel. The mother delivered him on the 25th of September meanwhile her EDD was the 1st week of December. They needed urgent help and the foundation decided to give the help. With a weight of less than 1 kg, he was placed on the 1st line treatment and after a while the 2nd line treatment and after 47 days in the hospital, Lemuel was discharged on the 12th of November 2019 with a weight of 2.075 kg.

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Niek Marvelous

The mother is a 15 year old girl who came to the District Hospital from the bush on the 14th of June 2019 with nothing. The General Supervisor of the Hospital called Needs For Children for help and before we could reach, the girl had already put to birth a bouncing baby boy. Niek Marvelous. The foundation paid for the delivery fee and provided her with maternity needs.

Ron Miracle

Ron is the 1st child of our teenage pregnant girl project. He was delivered on the 27^{th} of August 2019 and fell sick of jaundice on the 1st of September 2019. He was brought to the District hospital and Needs For Children took care of him. After 6 days he was completely fine and discharged from the hospital on the 9th of September 2019. $54\ 200\ cfa = 6\ 82,75$





Tabe Maxwell

Maxwell, 18 years, had a hernia and was operated upon 2 years back. It resurfaced again and it was difficult for him to work. The foundation decided to make him consult by the doctor and an operation was scheduled the next day. Maxwell was operated and the doctors found out that he also had a growing appendicitis. So they just removed it while operating the hernia. He has recovered well.

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Tobo Assurance

A baby girl of 1 year and 3 months old. The mother brought her to Mbingo hospital in Kumba from the bush because of the crisis. Once at Mbingo hospital, the mother had no money for the child's treatment so they were referred to the District Hospital. It was at the District Hospital that Needs For Children was called for help because the child was anemic, malnourished and had Malaria. And so the foundation did. After 5 days of treatment, Assurance was discharge in good health.

Wisdom Ndingi

The foundation helped Wisdom Ndingi 2 years ago and we were happy to see him again at the Day of the African Child. But before the end of the program, he was feeling feverish and we gave him paracetamol to drink. On the 18th of June, his grand-mother called to inform us that he was still sick and Needs For Children decided to consult him. He was consulted and diagnosed of ASLO and severe Malaria. Wisdom was treated and send back in better health.

Many times children come to our office when they need help or the hospital calls us when there is a desperate case. But sometimes we have to go search for them. The once in the villages that don't have the means to come to Kumba.

Any child who we helped has their own file with detail information, pictures and financial report. These can be seen on request.



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
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3) Prison

At least once a month the team of Needs For Children visits the young inmates between 0 and 21 years old in the prison. In order to give them the feeling that we are there for them and that there is a group who put their effort to help them. Every month we give them education about a subject that the children and young adults want to know more about. The inmates had various teaching this year. About malaria, teeth brushing, tuberculosis etc. they had all together 11 visits. We also bring them things they need, like soap, slippers, medication, towels etc. Beside that we motivate them to make hand crafts and to sell them. We teach them new creative hand crafts. To buy this from them, they remain motivated. Needs For Children works closely with the police to make this project go smoothly. Beside the monthly visite, there were also two majors programs carried out.

But this time around, because of the socio-political crisis in the North-West and South-West region of the country, the separatists banned people from sitting together. So the team in Cameroon shared the token amongst themselves.

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5) Maternity

The maternity of the Ejed Clinic has always been part of Needs For Children. In the past years we did several renovations. This year we started a project to help young pregnant girls. They can be followed up during the whole pregnancy free of charge. Also the delivery fee and the first needs for the baby will be taken care of. This year started off with two cases.

Avetus Eyoh



Avetus, 16 years old, was a young pregnant girl whom the team saw during one of the community visits. Her pregnancy was 7 months old and she had never attended antenatal nor gone to a hospital. Above all, she hadn't bought anything for the baby.

On her first antenatal visit, her baby was fine but after the lab tests conducted, the mother had gonorrhea and another parasite. She was given drugs by Ejed Clinic and booked for the next meeting in the next month. She followed up her visits keenly and on the 26th of August she gave birth to a bouncing baby boy. She gave birth before her EDD (Expected Date of Delivery) that was slated on the 16th of September. The baby was named after the person who donated money for this particular case: Ron Miracle.

Ngum Clementine

Clementine was the second case who unfortunately did not continue her antenatal till the end. She was brought to Needs For Children in August by a post office worker. The girl was pregnant from a taxi man in Buea who promised to help her but instead slept with her and sent her away the following morning. That is how she found herself in Kumba with no place to stay until Mr. Mpenda found her and decided to help her. She came her first antennal on the 15th of August 2019 and had never come again till date. Mr. Mpenda made us to understand that she has met a guy who wants to married her and left with her.

Needs For Children works closely with other local organizations and ministries. This to be able to reach more goals and to make more things possible.


The year started with sending all the partner organization our New Year Wishes. Together we are strong and can do more better. 7 500 cfa = \leq 11,45

The District Hospital in Kumba welcomed the new director. And so did we. 1 000 cfa = € 1,53










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7) Office

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Preview 2020

1. Expected projects

* Medical support to children:

Focuss more on providing medical support to individual children. With the crisis going on, many children have run together with their family their villages because of the danger. So it is difficult to trace them. When they get sick they often don't have the resources to go to a hospital. We want to help those children. However we will draw a clear limit to how far we help. It is expected that the family will also contribute a percentage. In order to have more chance of success.

* Prison project:

Visit the prison every month to offer them information and help. Beside that we want to help the minor inmates whenever they are sick and need treatment outside of the prison.

* Orphanages:

Keep on supporting the orphanages in and around Kumba, in every possible way.

* Participation on Day of the African Child or Youthday:

A day to bring all the children together we have ever helped. This to see how they are doing and to give them a nice happy day together.

* Maternity renovation project:

To make the Maternity attract more people and to make sure a girl can deliver safe, the maternity needs to be renovated. Now it looks old and does not have the full equipment.

* Teenage Pregnant Girls Program:

In 2019 we started it as a trial. This year, 2020, we have to make it available for more girls. In collaboration with Ejed Clinic we will follow up the girls during their whole pregnancy with lab tests, checkups and echography. We will also do the delivery and take care of all the costs. The girls will be send home with full equipment for the baby.

* Apart from these projects the Needs for Children foundation also offers materials to children who need it. This can vary from clothes to toys, and so on. For this reason we try to send the materials we receive from people from the Netherlands as much as possible to Cameroon so the foundation can distribute it.

There are much more possible projects next the mentioned ones but we try to look at the specific needs at every moment. Needs for Children is synonymous for small scale projects!
